Pinotage 38% | Shiraz 38% | Durif 20% | Other Varietals 4%

##### **ANALYSIS**

Alc: 13.2% | R.S: 3.3g/l | T.A: 5.8g/l | Ph: 3.49

##### **TASTING NOTES**

Red berries, sour cherries, subtle tobacco and sweet spice abound. This easy-drinking wine has smooth, ripe tannins and layers of fresh fruit supported by gentle oak.

##### **AGEING POTENTIAL**

This wine will continue to improve with a few years of bottle age from vintage.

##### **THE VINEYARD**

Pinotage came from a very large block of dry farmed grapes in the Voor Paardeberg and also from Silkbush Farm in the Breedekloof, Shiraz from Walker Bay and Durif from Franschhoek.

##### **WINEMAKING**

The Pinotage and Shiraz were fermented in stainless steel tanks with the latter being whole-bunch fermented, while the Durif was fermented in oak barrels using only natural yeast.

Total production 16,500 bottles.

##### **THE STORY OF THIS WINE**

Wild dogs and cyclists have much in common: individual prowess, teamwork, energy, camaraderie and a never give-up attitude.
